October 11-13, 2002

9 a.m. - 5 p.m. daily

4-H Education & Conference Center, Salem

Registration: \$55 (includes 3 lunches).

Overnight Lodging: \$28 per night shared lodging (includes Friday dinner and 2 breakfasts).

Located in the beautiful rolling Eola Hills 7 miles northwest of Salem, the center includes 325 acres of mixed forests, meadows and ponds. Miles of hiking trails make this an ideal setting for exploring and learning about local flora and fauna.

Camp Rilea, Warrenton, Oregon

Registration: \$55 (includes lunch & continental breakfast each day).
